CREATIVE TEXTILE COURSES



15 East Shore Pittenweem Fife Studio open: Thur/Fri/Sat 11.00-4.00 hand knitting hand weaving tapestry



Pittenweem is an ideal location for a Weft course in creative hand knitting. The two courses in Creating Surface Texture and Developing Three Dimensional Forms are inspired by the rich history of Scottish knitted textiles, such as the Fisherman's Gansey, Fair Isle, and Shetland Lace. Both courses reflect the strong local hand-knitting tradition, which is still very much alive in the town.

The emphasis of the teaching is on individual creativity and the development of new ways of interpreting traditional structures, to produce innovative fabric designs.

Weft studio offers a range of weaving courses, with an emphasis on experimental fabric making, using four and eight shaft table looms.

All looms are prepared in advance, so that teaching can focus on the use of yarns and methods to create colour effects, pattern and surface texture.

Students joining the Introduction to Weaving course will explore a variety of basic weaves and compile their own sample book of unique woven textile designs.

Intermediate classes focus on the development of expertise in specific weave structures such as twills, weft pile and overshot.

The spectacular Fife coast is a rich source of inspiration for Weft contemporary tapestry courses, which explore the creative potential of traditional and non-traditional fibre techniques.

Pittenweem harbour provides a central theme, and is an ideal starting point for the development of textile constructions and mixed media work. The Introduction to Woven Tapestry course, which involves the completion of a basic Gobelin tapestry sampler, is suitable for complete beginners. While courses such as The Woven Image and Constructing Sea Forms, which focus on the the development of small textile artworks may require some previous art or design experience.
